

## What is Teen Choices?

Teen Choices is a **teen health clinic** located at the health department in **Sanford**. All services are provided in a safe, friendly and confidential setting.

The Teen Choices mission is to provide sexual health and family planning education to teens.

## Advantages of Teen Choices

- Created with input from teens.
- You get to make the choice about your health.

### FACT:

Sexually active teens who don't use protection during intercourse have an **85-90% chance of becoming pregnant over the course of one year.**

## What You Can Expect at Your Visit

- You will meet with a Licensed Healthcare Provider to talk about your medical history and ask questions.
- If medication is required, it will be given to you at your visit or you can take your prescription to a pharmacy of your choice.

## Common STDs

- Chlamydia
- Genital Warts
- Gonorrhea
- Hepatitis B
- Herpes
- HIV/AIDS
- Syphilis
- Trichomoniasis ("Trich")

### STD FACT:

- Chlamydia is the #1 STD in young adults ages 15-24.
- Recurrent Chlamydia infections can lead to infertility in both males and females.
- Many people have no symptoms.

**FACT:** Teens 15 and older who drink are seven times more likely to have sexual intercourse and twice as likely to have it with four or more partners than non-drinking teens. 53% of teens say the main reason teens do not use protection is because of drinking or using drugs.

### FACT:

More than one-half of teens (52%) surveyed recently said that one of the main reasons that teens do not use birth control is because their partners don't want to.

### FACT:

Nearly one-third of teen girls used *NO* contraception the last time they had sex.
