<b>Guest Presenters</b>	<p><b>Go Noodle – Tracy Coats, Partner Relationship Director, Go Noodle</b></p> <p>Tracy Coats presented information about Go Noodle which is an on-line physical activity resource for schools. The program was started 10 years ago, with the idea to get students to take physical activity breaks during their class period. Research shows that students who are able to integrate physical activity breaks in their day make better learners. The teachers can access the short videos online (3 minutes and 45 seconds) to plan their curriculums, and can filter content by grade and by category. Activities may also be paired up according to subjects such as Math, Science or English, and may be used as learning extensions. Longer videos are also available. Seminole County, through a federal SNAPEd grant was able to fund the program for Seminole County Public Schools. Currently 13 Title I schools are able to access the program. Teachers may also send links to parents at home to access content including videos, printouts and follow-up activities. Currently there are about 200 teachers participating in the program and students have been able to achieve over 760,000 minutes of activity.

**New Special Enrollment Period/Marketplace-Anne Packham, Marketplace Project Director, Primary Care Access Network**

Anne shared that many Americans have lost their jobs and insurances due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Insurance Marketplace has a special enrollment period starting February 15, 2021 until March 15, 2021. This special period works just like a regular open enrollment period. Also, Florida Kid-Care applications have been on hold since December 2020 due to security breach. She also shared that the application for Kid Care may be a bit more complicated due to this. She recommended individuals who are interested in applying for Kid Care should reach out to a navigator to walk them through the process.

**BrightStart Pediatrics- Pete Stoll, Business Development, BrightStart Pediatrics**

BrightStart Pediatrics is PPE (Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care), a nursing and therapy center for medically fragile infants and children up to five years of age. The center is locally own and operated and care is provided by qualified professionals that are also multi-lingual, pediatric nurses and aides, working together with, physical speech and occupational therapists on site. Medical directors are available on site for consultation and develop care plans for the children receiving services. The center serves babies right out of NICU who may require tube feeding, ventilator management or other medically complex care, and provides health care and socialization activities during the day while parents are at work. They offer separate spaces to support different developmental levels. Florida Medicaid covers services. The center is open Mon-Fri from 7am to 6:30pm.

**Valtoco, Seizure Rescue Medication, Lisa Wimberly, Territory Manager and Denise Davies, Regional Business Director, Neurelis**

Valtoco is a diazepam nasal spray medication for treatment of seizure. Although the active ingredient has been used by medical professionals for over 50 years for epilepsy, Valtoco provides a new nasal administration of the medication. Other seizure medications are difficult to administer. Valtoco is portable, easy to carry and is discreet and may be administered whenever it is needed. Few side effects associated with Valtoco include
